MINISTRY:

There will be an Orientation Meeting on June 7, 2023. You will be given a tentative schedule of ministry, briefing on the Irish culture and ministry specifics. You go to minister hope in this country and will be building relationships with the Irish people.

WEATHER and PACKING:

The average temperatures in Cork in June should be around 60 degrees. It might rain. Long trousers, light coats, and light sweaters are generally enough, but also bring rain gear just in case. Casual attire is fine for traveling in this area.

MONEY AND SHOPPING:

There will be a day of shopping and sightseeing in Cork. Most major credit cards are widely accepted in Ireland. The local currency is Euros. You will be able to exchange your money at the currency exchange office in Cork. We recommend \$200-\$300 for extra drinks or treats and souvenirs.

Ireland Packing List

5. Two “church outfits” (optional)

8. Long jeans, coats, light sweaters, & rain gear for cooler days
9. Good walking shoes
10. **Please check the actual weather during our stay on weather.com about 4-5 days prior to departure to ensure weather-appropriate clothing is packed**
11. INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL RULES:
 - One piece: 'Carry On' Luggage** to fit under seat or in compartment above. Luggage that exceeds the approved size must be checked in as “Additional Baggage” at the passenger’s expense.
 - One piece: ‘Check In’ Luggage** (check with your airline for weight limit)

13. Spending cash/Credit cards for souvenirs, shopping and extras not included in your trip (e.g. soda, coffee, ice cream, admission to some tourist sights, etc.)
14. **All prescription medicines (in original bottles and bring in your carry on, not your checked bag)**
15. Do not bring expensive jewelry and watches
16. World Missions Alliance ministers outside of the USA the Voltage is 220. Voltage transformers are not encouraged. They normally create more problems than they help. Hair dryers are not provided at the hotel. You will be able to charge laptops and cell phones if you purchase a suitable **plug adapter**. These can be purchased at Walmart; Kmart; Radio Shack or any other travel store. Know the difference between an adaptor and a converter [note: a converter is used to convert the voltage of an electric device. For example, if your hairdryer requires 110V, you will need an converter when traveling to Europe, which runs on 220V. An adapter allows you to plug your American two-pronged plug into a different outlet. Use this for dual-voltage devices; for example, your laptop computer and cellphone charger.]
